- v. CALISTA, b. ca. 1797; m. 19 Apr. 1815 MERRITT POTTER of Granville. She was living in 1844 when named in her mother's will.
- vi. THERON C[USHMAN], b. ca. 1799; living in 1844 when named in his mother's will. He is listed at Cambridge in the 1825 census with a family of two males and three females. He was not there in 1835 but the 1840 census lists a Theron Gifford at Auburn, Cayuga Co., N. Y., where he evidently had living with him two sons and five daughters.
- vii. ISAAC, b. ca. 1801; m. "out of meeting" ca. 1825 MARY ANN VAN VALKENBURG. He was disowned by the Easton Monthly Meeting for his marriage. He was living in 1832 when named in his father's will but possibly died before 1844, when his mother's will does not name him. A search in Dutch Reform Church records is indicated.

**134.** WILLIAM<sup>5</sup> GIFFORD (*Adam<sup>1</sup>, Jeremiah<sup>3</sup>, Robert<sup>2</sup>, William<sup>1</sup>*) was born 28 July 1755 and died 24 July 1824 "ae. 69y. 19d., husband of Frelove." Also on the monument are Adam and Anna. He is buried at Newtown Friends Burying Ground, Faunce's Corner Road, North Dartmouth (DAVR, CR3, GR 12).

He married 31 May 1781 FREELOVE POTTER, daughter of Abner and Patience (Macomber) Potter of Dartmouth, who was born 7 January 1759 and died 18 June 1847 "ae. 88y.5m.11d." (DAVR).

The will of Adam Gifford gave to this only surviving son, William Gifford, the major portion of his estate, and made him sole executor.

William Gifford is listed in the 1790 census as head of a Dartmouth household of one male over 16, three males under 16, and five females. In the 1800 Westport census William Gifford had a family of one male under 10, one between 16 and 25, and one over 45; two females under 10, two between 10 and 16, and one between 26 and 45. In 1810 the family consisted of one male between 10 and 16, one over 45; two females between 16 and 26, and one over 45. In the 1800 census he is called a miller.

**135.** ARCHIPAS<sup>5</sup> GIFFORD (*David<sup>4</sup>, Jeremiah<sup>3</sup>, Robert<sup>2</sup>, William<sup>1</sup>*) was born circa 1751 and died after 15 June 1831, perhaps in Savoy, Berkshire County, Massachusetts, as late as 1848.

He married (intentions at Dartmouth, 6 January 1786) ELIZABETH FISHER, "both of Dartmouth" (*DAVR*).

Archipas Gifford of Dartmouth, by deed of 4 April 1810, purchased a tract of land in Savoy—the homestead farm of Consider Crapo and his wife Mercy (Berkshire Co. Deeds). Probably he removed there about that time, as a deed dated 18 April 1810 conveys for \$300 paid by William Gifford of Dartmouth "all my homestead farm" together with two other lots, all in Dartmouth. His wife Elizabeth released her dower rights (BRCD, 19:479).

There are deeds in the name of Archipas Gifford in the Berkshire County Registry. By one, 15 June 1831, he sold to Levi Gifford (his grandson) a tract of land in Savoy. This was not recorded until 27 April 1848, about the time members of the family were moving to Hartsville, New York.

- i. DAVID<sup>6</sup>, b. ca. 1789, prob. at Dartmouth; d. Florida, Mass., in 1862 (g.s.); m. 26 June 1806 NANCY BAKER, b. ca. 1790-95. David Gifford purchased land at Clarksburg (in that part that was annexed to Florida) in 1846. He removed with his family about 1848 to Hartsville, Steuben Co., N. Y. He had issue.
