

Hoag; son Perry Brightman; daughter Patience Burch, widow of Jacob W. Burch. She made Jacob Myer sole executor. The will was witnessed by Orin Marshall of Charlton, Saratoga Co., N.Y., and Nelson Marshall. The citation locates the heirs: Patience Burch of Schaghticoke, Lois Hoag of Vandalia, Ill., and Perry Brightman of Hartford, Conn. (*ibid.*, 26:180).

172. RICHARD⁵ GIFFORD (*William⁴, Christopher³⁻², William¹*) was born 28 November 1760, and died at Westport, 5 February 1849 "of lung fever."

He married 18 December 1788, REBECCA COOK, who was born 18 December 1766, and died 3 October 1843. She and her husband are buried in Beech Grove Cemetery, Central Village, Westport.

Richard Gifford and his family lived on the homestead farm willed to him by his father.

The 1790 Census lists Richard Gifford in Westport, head of a family of one male over 16, and two females. In 1800, one more son and one more daughter had joined the family. The 1810 Census shows another daughter.

173. RUSSELL⁵ GIFFORD (*William⁴, Christopher³⁻², William¹*) was born 29 January 1773.

He married at Westport, 17 April 1796, BETSY EARL, daughter of George and Susanna (Hilyard) Earl, who was born at Little Compton, 28 October 1781 (Little Compton Records).

Both the will of his father William and that of his brother William, Jr., bequeath to this man.

Russell Gifford appears at Westport in the 1800 Census with two children under 10. In 1810 those two are between 10 and 16, and one male under 10, and two females under 10 have joined the family. There is no record of the births of these latter children.
